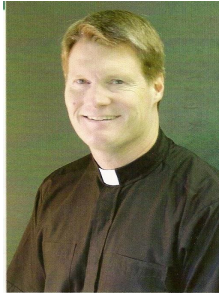

Dear Friends;

Have you ever had an epiphany? It's not a surgical procedure. It's a moment of revelation, when things all of a sudden become clear to you. It's been described as an "ah ha!" moment. That's the first type of epiphany.

There's another kind of Epiphany – Epiphany is also the name of a season in the church year.

We're in the middle of the church season of Epiphany right now. Epiphany begins after the season of Christmas and lasts until Ash Wednesday (Feb. 22 this year) when the season of Lent begins.

During the season of Epiphany we commemorate the revelation of Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah, the Christ, of whom the prophets spoke. Our readings on Sundays during Epiphany repeat prophecies of the Christ and also describe moments of revelation when Jesus was revealed as the Christ to his followers.

But back to the first kind of epiphany – the flash of revelation, the "ah ha!" moment when something becomes clear, when you finally understand something you've struggled to understand; Have you ever had an epiphany?

Martin Luther had one in the year 1519. He'd already made a name for himself as a scholar. He'd already stirred up trouble with the Catholic Church hierarchy by posting his 95 theses. But that year he had an epiphany. Something dawned on him that changed his life – and changed yours.

Martin Luther suddenly understood the meaning of the phrase "the righteousness of God" found throughout scripture, particularly in Romans.

Up to that point Martin Luther felt threatened and even terrorized by the "righteousness of God." He said he was "angry with God." In fact he wrote; "I did not love, I hated the righteous God who punishes sinners."

But eventually, Martin Luther had an epiphany:

"At last, by the mercy of God, meditating day and night, I gave heed to the context of the words... there I began to understand that the righteousness of God is that by which the righteous lives by a gift of God."

None of us are righteous on our own. "There is no one who is righteous, no not one." (Romans 3:10) But we have received a gift – righteousness from God, given to us who are by nature unrighteous, but who believe, who have faith in God.

"For in the Gospel (the good news of forgiveness) a righteousness from God is revealed, a righteousness that is by faith, from first to last." (Romans 1:17)

This status of "righteous" that has been bestowed upon us who cling to Jesus in faith, and depend upon him for our salvation, means that we are acceptable in God's eyes, we're "justified" in the sight of God. We're forgiven! What a gift for us who believe!

God certainly loves us!

QUILTERS:

Thank you to all the folks that have donated fabrics etc. Please be advised that we are unable to use some blankets, like the open-weave ones for filler. We cannot use Duvet cover or mattress pads either. Even though they are fluffy, they cannot be used. We do appreciate the donations but just want to let folks know that we do have to find a home for them, such as Good Will or Salvation Army. We still will accept unspotted sheets and fabrics that are mostly cotton. Also, we would like the names of folks dropping off fabric for us so we can thank them. I always think of the donations as the Fabric Fairy stopping by.

Recently we had a suggestion that Comfort Quilts could be used as an Outreach to homebound individuals and Nursing homes, which was such a wonderful idea. I wonder if there are other women out there who would like to help with quilts. If there were more folks that would come, perhaps we could do some of those things. However, there only 8 quilters currently coming from 9- 12 weekly on Tuesdays. And, on a given week, maybe 6 women arrive to work. We all have a time we need to be away, but would appreciate all the additional volunteers we can get.

For some reason, I have lost count of the number of quilts sent to LWR, Joplin and the Pregnancy Center. However, very nice thank-you letters were received from them (see article below). At present, we have about 15 quilts that are layered and tied and some are ready for the seamstress to sew around. We average about two to three quilts a week. We take time for greetings (Hi, how are you stuff) and then we begin work. We end the day with a prayer. This does not include time spent on most of the quilt tops, which are sewn by these gals at home.

It is with Joy that I have been allowed to step in and give the marching orders for the quilters. I hear people say, "ask the boss". I don't think of myself as a boss, but since manning a household of 7 for years (which has extended to 34), I probably do carry some of the bossy technique. :-)

I pray that each of you will accept this person's rendition and we will be looking forward to seeing more folks interested in the labors of love that happen every Tuesday from 9-12. If you do not desire to come and join us, please pray for this endeavor. You know a person (someone) could do---whatever --. This person, (Lorraine) looks forward to spending time with the special women on Tuesday mornings.

Excerpts from letters sent to CTV Quilters from Immanuel Lutheran Church and Martin Luther School in Joplin, Missouri. The letters were signed by Jeremy Schamber, Principal, Martin Lutheran School and Tim Hetzner, President, Lutheran Church Charities:

Matthew 25 guides our response to the tornado that has devastated our city. Our campus, which sustained damage but remained structurally sound, is located just one block from the disaster area. Soon after we discovered that our buildings were safe and that the school had power, the relief efforts began.

Initially, we set up the gym for donations of relief supplies. Supplies soon filled the gym, the classrooms were piled to the ceiling. A medical team arrived and established a clinic in several of the classrooms. Utility vehicles arrived, and we began sending out teams with supplies, food, and water into neighborhoods where other vehicles could not travel. Area churches began sending meals to serve from the school kitchen. Pastors and counselors with crisis training came to listen and pray with hurting people. Volunteers arrived to help in a variety of ways. Plans for future and ongoing needs such as childcare continue. **We want to personally thank you for your faithful gift of quilts and \$50.00.** Your gifts allow us to reach many hurting people with the love of Christ.

Stewardship Committee

The Stewardship Committee wants to thank all those who helped to pull together the 2012 church budget. A special thanks goes out to Jim Carow who spent countless hours organizing the budget information so that it could be easily understood and presented to the congregation for approval.

For those members that were unable to attend the budget meeting here are a few of the highlights:

- The 2012 budget of \$336,396 is 1.1% higher than last years budget of \$332,703
- The 2012 budget of \$336,396 is 2.3% higher than last years actual giving of \$328,770. Only a slight increase in giving is required to meet this year's budget.
- The budget does not contain funds for deferred maintenance items, which exceed \$25,000. Separate fund raising or increased tithing will be required to cover these items.

Thanks again to all those who contributed their time and talent in preparing the 2012 church budget.

Elders Report

January 3, 2012 - The meeting was called to order by the Chair at 7:00 pm and Pastor opened the meeting in God's House using the Order of Vespers. We sang together, read the Introit for The Baptism of Our Lord, knelt before His alter in prayer, first for ourselves, recognizing our own sinfulness, seeking His mercy and compassion, and then that we in like manner might love one another. We continued in prayer for those on our hearts and for those Pastor named within our congregation that were desirous of our supplications, ending with The Lord's Prayer.

Members present were: Bob Fligg, Vince Jacob, Scott Turley, Walt Wilmarth, Bill Balke, and Pastor Morris. Absent: Alec Finney

The Chair distributed copies of the Agenda and Elder Duty Schedule; the agenda was accepted as printed. Inasmuch as we are at the beginning of another year, it is time for all LCMS congregations to prepare an Annual Parish Report. The Chair will encourage Alec Finney to work with Jackie Eastvedt if needed to enter and run all of the reports needed for this document. The Parish Report will be placed on our February agenda.

The elder surveys for Pastor's Annual review were compiled into a summary report of commendations and recommendations and were forwarded to Pastor on this date; discussion of the same was tabled until our February meeting.

Pastor shared an attendance and visit report for the month of November; average attendance was 160 with sixteen visits equally divided between hospital and home. He performed two official acts: a wedding November 27 in Olympia, and the baptism of Nora Jane Paynter on November 13, 2011.

A Memo entitled "Renewing the Spirit" from our Director of Worshiping, Dan Hermes was printed and shared with the members. Pastor shared comments regarding the intent and asked the elders to be supportive in whatever manner possible, and to use forthcoming information regarding the same in their calling and conversations with assigned families. The first such event is scheduled for Saturday, January 7th – The Epiphany Party – moving decorations from Christmas to Epiphany. The afternoon of work will conclude with a Pot-Luck meal at 4:30 or thereabouts.

Pastor expressed concern about our website, and the need to greatly enhance appearance of the same. This item did not get included in our annual budget, and consequently financial resources are required for development of the same. Several options were shared for funding.

The Elder Duty schedule was distributed and updated regarding assignments. Members of the congregation with the gift of public reading may be solicited and scheduled for reading of the lectionaries, by elder "on duty." Pastor will provide the elders with known individuals desiring to serve in this manner. (see October 4 Elder Minutes)

Brief comments were given regarding the Advent/Christmas seasons, with gratitude for the decorations, music, and worship opportunities. Special recognition should be given to Nathan Schmidt for colorful cross focusing our attention on the reason for His coming into the world.

Thoughts now turn to worship during the Epiphany season, Ash Wednesday as the beginning of Lent, and an earlier Easter, April 8th.

Pastor would like to see us offer a mid-week Bible Class (4-6 weeks in length) prior to the beginning of Lent – February 22. If anyone would be interested in hosting/leading the same should contact Pastor.

Pastor concluded our meeting with the Aaronic Benediction (Numbers 6:24-26).

Parish Planning Council (PPC) Minutes – January 24, 2012

Pastor opened with a Bible reading and prayer. Moved, seconded, carried to approve the minutes of the November meeting.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS - None

FINANCIAL REPORT - Ursula reported that the church is operating in the black and meeting expenses. The figures are good indicators that giving is up.

COMMITTEE REPORTS are attached. Comments, additions:

--TRUSTEES: Tim had been asked to provide estimates for **deferred maintenance items** not included in the budget. Grape Room carpet (\$10,000) and Grape Room heating system upgrade ((\$8-12,000)) are two most pressing and costly. The other three items on his list are rekeying exterior doors (\$400), obsolete lighting fixtures upgrade (\$2,000) and electrical upgrades for Grape Room (\$2,500).

--YOUTH BOARD: Pastor Metcalf, who helps with arrangements for the Youth mission trips, wants to visit Christ the Vine before summer to talk about LAMP.

--WORSHIP BOARD: Scott Schlimpert has to resign as our music director because of time constraints. Brandon Tate is back in this area and might be interested in the position; Pastor said he should find out within the next few days.

NEW BUSINESS

WORSHIP BOARD – Pastor presented in Dan Hermes' absence. The Board is proposing a new effort they are calling Renewing the Spirit. The idea could be twofold: to foster increased support, enthusiasm and camaraderie within the congregation, and to open hearts to the leading of the Holy Spirit. Response among the Council was positive. The next step for the Board is developing a calendar of events.

ENDOWMENT FUND COMMITTEE – In an effort to promote endowment, the committee is proposing working with Theresa Farrow, who works with The Lutheran Hour, and an attorney to conduct seminars to educate congregations about wills and estates. In Quinten Fadness' stead, Pastor asked if PPC would allot 45 minutes at the next meeting to hear her presentation and determine whether to offer a seminar at CTV. Moved, seconded, carried.

BUDGET COMMITTEE ISSUES – Jim Carow thanked Stewardship Board for their dedication to budget issues; John Henry Hingson, in turn, again thanked Jim for his tremendous effort in preparing the budget for presentation.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE – Vickie is suggesting that a committee be established soon to start work in February, rather than March, to allow more time for their task of developing a slate of candidates for voting in June 2012. She said a roster would be helpful to know who communicant members are. Bill said Elders are working on reviewing a current list. Vickie agreed to serve as chair again with the understanding she will train someone else to do it next year. Pat volunteered to be another PPC member to serve. They will recruit four communicant members from the congregation.

Bill Balke thanked Megan McWilliams and other youth for working in the nursery during second service, while commenting that he enjoyed the sound of babies during the service. Bill suggested that reports for Council meetings be turned in a week earlier so Kevin can include any motions on the agenda. Pastor will ask Jackie to send out the notice a week earlier.

Jim Carow thanked everyone for their support since his mom's recent passing.

PASTOR'S REPORT – as submitted.
